The difference between tactical maintenance tools and strategic enterprise asset management and why it matters to your bottom line.

THE SHORT ANSWER

A **CMMS** is a *tactical* tool for managing maintenance work; work orders, PMs, and spare parts. An **EAM** platform like **IBM’s Maximo Application Suite (MAS)** is a *strategic* system that manages the lifecycle, performance, risk, and financial value of every asset across the enterprise. A CMMS keeps the lights on. An EAM tells you whether to **repair, replace, or redeploy** an asset and predicts failures before they happen.

01 – CMMS: TACTICAL MAINTENANCE EXECUTION

Managing the Work

A CMMS answers one question: *“What maintenance needs to get done, and did we do it?”* It typically covers work order management, preventive maintenance scheduling, basic asset records, and MRO inventory tracking. Its scope is the maintenance department, and its time horizon is the present; today’s and this week’s work. Fundamentally, it is a system of record for maintenance activity, usually deployed at a single site.

02 – EAM: STRATEGIC ASSET LIFECYCLE MANAGEMENT

Managing the Value

An EAM answers a far broader question: *“How do we maximize the value, reliability, and return on every asset across its entire life — and across the whole organization?”* It includes everything a CMMS does, then adds the strategic layer:

- **Asset lifecycle management** from acquisition through disposal
- **Reliability engineering** (RCM / FMEA) to eliminate root-cause failure modes
- **Condition-based and predictive maintenance** driven by live sensor data and AI
- **Capital planning, compliance, and risk management** across the enterprise
- **Enterprise financial visibility**: the return on assets and total cost of ownership

Its scope is the whole organization across multiple sites, and its horizon spans the full asset life, years and decades, not days.

03 — CMMS VS. EAM AT A GLANCE

04 — WHERE IBM MAS GOES BEYOND ANY CMMS

A CMMS optimizes the maintenance department. An EAM optimizes the enterprise. The difference shows up on the bottom line:
